Noguchi Museum

If you're looking to stay Queens-bound, why not try the Noguchi Museum? Created by the sculptor Isamu Noguchi, it was one of the first museums in the United States created by an artist to preserve their own work. The museum has both indoor and outdoor components including a sculpture garden.

The Frick Collection

A very rich industrialist named Henry Clay Frick, who also happened to have a predilection for fancy art, willed his house and all of its enclosed artifacts to the public upon his death, whereupon it became a museum. Brooklyn Museum
